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SOME MORE CRETAN NAMES

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Scholars interested in ancient Greek history, prosopography, philology, religion, and linguistics alike will certainly find the recently published British Academy's Lexicon of Greek Personal Names (abbr. LGPN)¹ a valuable reference work. Its editors were of cource aware of the fact that some of their decisions about the arrangement of the whole work, its general character as a combination of a Greek onomasticon and a Greek prosopography, or the exclusion of groups of names will attract criticism, but neither such unavoidable decisions nor minor errors and omissions can lessen the importance of this work.

The editors' policy is not to include unpublished material (although there are some exceptions, including Crete), but, following the praxis of the Bulletin épigraphique and the Supplementum Epigraphicum Graecum, to take into consideration epigraphical finds presented or mentioned in archaeological reports² or sometimes in newspapers (up to 1986).³ Obviously, neither have all such reports been studied consistently, nor full use has been made of the ones that have been studied; in addition, some publications, mostly in not easily accessible Greek reviews, have been ommitted.

Responding to the editors' plan to include addenda in the 6th volume, I would like to present in this paper some more Cretans, ommitted in the first volume of LGPN; they are persons that are in most cases attested in inscriptions preliminarily published or mentioned in archaeological reports.⁴ Unfortunately, as it too often happens in Greek epigraphy, the greater part of the material presented here has been found decades ago (mostly in the '50s and '60s) and has never been published. By collecting and presenting these epigraphica

neglecta, but not rapta. I also hope to attract the interest of Museum and Archaeological School Directors on this material; this should make its prompt publication possible. It goes without saying that the text of an inscription is more important than the honour of its first publication and commentary.⁵

On this opportunity, I also comment on some Cretans included in LGPN, and make some suggestions for names which, although already known from published material, have not been identified as Cretan. Following the example of LGPN, fragmentary or abbreviated names are not taken into consideration, unless the expansion seemed reasonably certain, and in each entry I include the dialect-form of the name (in some cases also the anorthodox spelling and the fragmentary or abbreviated form, that occurs on the inscription); prosopographical data, 6 the origin of the person, the date and the character of the inscription, the bibliographical reference, and the number of other attestations of the name in Crete (according to LGPN). Where necessary, I comment on the text of the inscription or the form of the name. The following list includes 12 new names (or forms of names), i.e. names that are not included in the onomastica of Pape-Benseler, Bechtel-Fick and Bechtel⁷ or in the first volume of LGPN: Δείπων, Ἐπιλώιων, Ἡδίνους, Θυχάων, Λυκόνικος, Μάγης, Νεαθνητος (?), Νίκελος, Παισθενίδας, Cηρίων (i.e. Θηρίων), Τιλώ (?), and Τιμόεςςα. Another 26 names should be added to the Cretan onomastic: 'Ay $\alpha\theta$ îvoc, 'Ac $\kappa\lambda\alpha$ c, "Attıoc, Άφροδίτιος, Δόλων (?), Έρμείας, Εὐρύτιμος, Ζωή, Θάλιος, Θεάγγελος, Θεοδότιος, Θεύκριτος, Κάπις, Κνωςίων (?), Μαρίνος, Ματάλα, Μεγάρη, Νικιάδας, 'Ολυμπᾶς, Όρφάς, Πάρμων, Πολύδωρος, Cωςίτιμος, Τιμόδαμος, Τλᾶςις, and Υπάτιος.

Finally, a general remark on the policy of LGPN applies: Sometimes, magistrates that occur in inscriptions found in a sanctuary controlled by a major city are being wrongly registered under the place name of the sanctuary, not under the city from which they originate! All the magistrates named in the inscriptions found at the sanctuary of Zeus Thenatas in Amnisos are Knossians, possibly identical with, or relatives of other Knossians of the same name (see under Lasthenes), and not "Amnisians" (Amnisos was not a city in historical times); the magistrates named in Gortynian decrees found in the sanctuary of Lebena are of cource citizens of Gortyn and not "Lebenians"; as a result of this practice, one derives the mistaken picture of the names' distribution in Crete. Needless to say, what consequences this praxis might have, if it were to be applied for names attested in

inscriptions from sanctuaries of Asia Minor (say Didyma), thus arbitrarily separated from the onomastic material attested in the city that controls the sanctuary!

"Αρτεμις ("Αρτεμεις)

Agios Thomas Monofatsiou (territory of Gortyn), 2d c. A.D., epitaph.

P.Faure, BCH 80,1956,97 no.11; id., Fonctions des cavernes crétoises, Paris 1964, p.147 n.4; id., KretChron 21,1969,317 no.5.

Attested in Axos, Lato, Priansos, and in an unknown city (4); probably to be identified with Larcia Artemeis, known from an inscription found in the same place: IC I, xxxi p.310 no.2.

'Αςκλᾶς

Unknown origin, hellenistic age, inscription on a dedicatory snake in the Asklepieion of Lissos.

N.Platon, KretChron 12,1958,466; M.S.F.Hood, AR 1958,16; G.Daux, BCH 83,1959,754.

Not attested in Crete, numerous examples e.g. in Delos, Lesbos, Rhodes, Samos, and Thera (LGPN). We probably have to do with the name of the dedicant, not with the name of the god. The names 'Αςκλαπίων, 'Αςκλάπων, 'Αςκληπιάδης, and 'Αςκληπιόδοτος are attested in Crete (LGPN).

"Αττιος (s. 'Αρτεμίδωρος)

Lyttos, 2d/3d c. A.D., epitaph.

A.Lembesi, Deltion 32 B 2, 1977,316 pl.189 b; SEG XXXIV 921.

This Latin nomen gentile, only here attested in Crete to the best of my knowledge, is here used as a personal name. For the reading of the inscription see und 'Αρτεμίδωρος.

'Αφροδίτιος (f. 'Έρμων)

Liliano (territory of Lyttos), late imperial times, epitaph.

N.Platon, KretChron 8,1954,515; BCH 79,1955,304.

Not attested in Crete; numerous examples elsewhere (LGPN).

The name 'Αφροδιειὰε is attested in Lyttos and the name 'Αφροδιεία is well known in Crete (LGPN).

'Αχιλλεύς Ι (f. 'Αχιλλεύς ΙΙ)

Lyttos, no date, dedicatory pedestal

N.Platon, KretChron 5,1951,446; BCH 76,1952,242.

Attested in Lyttos (two persons) and Lato (4).

Γάμος

Cretan (?), imperial times, signature on lamps.

Some more occurances should be added to the examples in LGPN:

J.W.Hayes, BSA 66,1971,273 no.53 (one lamp in Knossos); J.Sakellarakis, Praktika 1983,462, 472, 477 (5 lamps in the Idean cave).

Γεώργιος

Neapolis (Eastern Crete), early byzantine period, ring.

C.Davaras, Deltion 32 B 2, 1977,335; SEG XXXIV 923.

Attested in Crete (no ethnic, 1). The inscription reads: ΥΠΔ Γεωργί, possibly $\dot{\upsilon}\pi(o)\delta(\iota\alpha\kappa\dot{o}\nu o\upsilon)$ Γεωργί(ου), 8 rather than $\dot{\upsilon}\pi\langle\dot{o}\rangle$ Γεωργί(ου) as suggested by H.W.Pleket, SEG XXXIV 923.

Δείπων (?)

Cretan ?, imperial times, inscribed vases found in the Idean cave.

IC I, xii p.97 no.3; J.Sakellarakis, Praktika 1983,486.

The reading $\Delta \epsilon i\pi o v\iota$ on the first potsherd has been confirmed through a second find. Such a name is not attested in LGPN and Pape-Benseler.

Δειτίλος (Διτίλ[ος])

Chersonesos, imperial times, epitaph.

S.Alexiou, Deltion 30 B 2, 1975,341 pl.247 a; SEG XXXIII 730.

Attested in Chersonesos, Lato, Lyttos, and in an unknown city (4). This Ditilos is probably to be identified with Deitilos, son of Sosos, also attested in Chersonesos (Deitilos 2 in LGPN).

Δεξικλης (f. Τιμόεςςα)

Aptara, no date, epitaph.

N.Platon, KretChron 12,1958,482; G.Daux, BCH 83,1959,751.

Already attested in Aptara (1).

Δέξιος (f. Cηρίων)

Elyros, hellenistic age, decree.

N.Platon, KretChron 13,1959,377; G.Daux, BCH 84,1960,852.

Attested in Biannos, Gortyn, Knossos, Lappa, Priansos, and in an unknown city (6).

Διονυςία

Hierapytna (?), 1st c. B.C., ring-stone.

C.Davaras, Deltion 32 B 2, 1977,336; SEG XXXIV 923.

Attested in Eleutherna and Lyttos (4).

Διοτέλης (T.Flavius, f. Κλήςιππος)

Lyttos, 2d c. A.D., honorific inscription.

A.Chaniotis, KretChron 26,1986,82-88 fig. 1-2.

Attested in Lyttos and Malla (3). This Διοτέλης is probably the same person as the father of Κούρνιος (Διοτέλης 2 in LGPN).

Δίφιλος

Aptara, no date, epitaph.

N.Platon, KretChron 12,1958,482; G.Daux, BCH 83,1959,751.

N.Platon reads [Δι]ίφιλος (attested e.g. in Kos); the form Δ ίφιλος is attested in Gortyn (LGPN).

Δόλων (?) (Δωλον)

Paliokastro Rethimnis, imperial times, graffito.

P.Faure, BCH 84,1960,204; id., KretChron 21,1969,319 no.8.

It is very questionable that we have to do with a personal name; Δ όλων is known as a slave-name in Athens; 9 cf. Δ ολα and Δ ολίνα in Thasos (LGPN).

'Επιλώιων (s. Θυχάων)

Moires (territory of Gortyn), 1st c. A.D., epitaph.

S.Alexiou, KretChron 22,1970,518; id., Deltion 25 B 2, 1970,460 pl.403 c.

Not attested in LGPN and Pape-Benseler. It is probably formed from the name Λωΐων (attested in Rhodes, LGPN) and the preposition ἐπί; cf. Ἐπαγαθίων, Ἐπάγαθος, Ἐπαμείνων or Ἐπικύδης (Crete, LGPN) and Λωΐνικος, Λῶιος and Λωϊώ. 10

Έρμείας

Kisamos, imperial times, epitaph.

N.Platon, KretChron 13,1959,392.

Not attested in Crete, numerous attestations elsewhere (LGPN); in Crete the names 'Ερμαία and 'Ερμαίος are well known (LGPN).

"Ερμων (s. 'Αφροδίτιος)

Liliano (territory of Lyttos), late imperial times, epitaph.

N.Platon, KretChron 8,1954,515; BCH 79,1955,304.

Attested in Hierapytna, Tylissos, and in an unknown city (3).

Εὐάγγελος (Εὐβανγέλου, f. 'Ακεςτίμα)

Neo Chorio Monofatsiou (area of Pyranthos), imperial times, epitaph.

N.Platon, KretChron 6,1952,479.

Attested in Gortyn, Lyttos, and in an unknown city (3).

Εὔμαχος

Melidochori, 5th c. B.C., graffito on a potsherd.

S.Alexiou, Deltion 22 B 2, 1967,487.

Attested in Eleutherna (1).

Εὐρύτιμος

Kydonia, 3d c. B.C., epitaph.

G.Touchais, BCH 105,1981,880 fig.212.

Not attested in LGPN; Pape-Benseler have two cases in Corinth and Koroneia; for Crete cf. Εὐρυάναξ, Εὐρύβατος, Εὐρυβώτας, Εὐρυθθενίας, Εὐρυκράτης, Εὐρύλαος, Εὐρύλοχος, Εὐρύμαχος, Εὐρύςτρατος etc. (LGPN).

Ζωή Ι (w. Μηνᾶς)

Unknown origin, 2d c. A.D., dedicatory epigram in the Tallean Cave.

IC II, xxviii p.303 no.2; restored by L.Gallavotti, BPEC 4,1983,113-116; SEG XXXIII 736.

Ζωή ΙΙ (w. Πέτρος)

Beran Episkopi (byz. Arion or Agrion), 9th c. A.D., dedicatory pillar.

K.D.Kalokyris, Praktika 1959,235; N.Platon, KretChron 13,1959,379; G.Daux, BCH 84,1960,850.

Not attested in Crete, but attested elsewhere (e.g. in Thasos, LGPN); for Crete cf. Ζωΐλος, Ζώϊτος and Ζωςίμα (LGPN).

Ἡδίνους, (s. Μελ-)

Matala, 2d c. B.C., Delphic list of theorodokoi.

P.Faure, KretChron 21,1969,328 and 330.

P.Faure improves the previous reading Ἡδύνους accepted in LGPN. No other attestations in LGPN and Pape-Benseler.

Θάλιος

Apollonia/Panormos (Agia Pelagia), late 6th c. B.C., dedicatory inscription.

Not attested in Crete, numerous attestations elsewhere (LGPN); for Crete cf. Θάλλος (LGPN).

Θεάγγελος (Θεάνγελος)

Knossos, 2d/1st c. B.C., lex sacra.

N.Platon, KretChron 2, 1948,94s. (ὁ Εὐάνγελος);¹¹ O.Masson, BCH 109,1985,189 and 193.

Not attested in Crete, but attested e.g. in Euboia (LGPN).

Θεοδόςιος

Olous, early byzantine times, inscribed dwarf-wall.

Emm.Borboudakis, Deltion 26 B 2, 1971,532 pl.548 c; P.Aupert, BCH 100,1976,727 fig.343.

Not attested in Crete, numerous examples elsewhere (LGPN).

Θεόμνης τος. (Θεώμνης τος, h. Καλλιόπα)

Lithines Sitias, 4th/5th c. A.D., epitaph.

G.Daux, BCH 83,1959,732 fig.2; P.Faure, KretChron 21,1969,315 no.2 fig.2.

Attested in Lyttos (1), the form Θεόμναςτος in Biannos and Lyttos (2).

Θεύκριτος

Aptara, 1st c. B.C., epitaph.

N.Platon, KretChron 12,1958,469; G.Daux 83,1959,750.

Not attested in Crete; numerous attestation elsewhere (LGPN). For Crete cf. Θεοκρίτα (Lyttos).

Θυχάων (s. Ἐπιλώϊων)

Moires (territory of Gortyn), 1st c. A.D., epitaph.

S.Alexiou, KretChron 22,1970,518; id., Deltion 25 B 2, 1970,460 pl.403 c.

Not attested in LGPN and Pape-Benseler; in Crete we know the names Θύχασιο (Knossos) and Τύχασιο (Lyttos), Θύχων (Gortyn) and Τύχων (Gortyn, Malla, Soulia).

Ίκαδίων (Ἰκα]δίωνος, f. -τίων)

Knossos, 2d c. B.C., epitaph.

H.W.Catling, AR 1973/74,35 fig.73; Deltion 29 B 3, 1973/74,905; P.Aupert, BCH 99,1975,690 fig.215; H.W.Catling-D.Smyth, BSA 71,1976,28s., 33 fig.7; SEG XXVI 1048, XXX 1111.

The editors read ---] $\tau i\omega v$ / ---] $\delta i\omega voc$, date the inscription in the 2d c. A.D., and regard the stone as an architectural block. The characters are clearly late hellenistic, and the text along with the form of the monument show that we have to do with a gravestone. As for the name, Ikadion is the only name attested in Crete which ends in $-\delta i\omega v$. The name is already known in Knossos. The son's name was probably Aristion, attested in Knossos, or Mnastion, attested in Lato, rather than Charmation, which is too long.

Καλλιόπα (Καλλιώπα, w. Θεόμνηςτος)

Lithines Sitias, 4th/5th c. A.D., epitaph.

G.Daux, BCH 83,1959,732 fig.2; P.Faure, KretChron 21,1969,315 no.2 fig.2.

Attested in Lato (1).

Κᾶπις (?) (ΚΑΠΙΟС---)

Apollonia/Panormos (Agia Pelagia), no date, graffito on a potsherd.

A.Ioannidou-Karetsou, Deltion 31 B 2, 1976,357; SEG XXXIV 914.

Not attested in LGPN. The name $K\hat{\eta}\pi\iota\epsilon$ is known in Athens (Pape-Benseler). In Crete we have the name $K\hat{\alpha}\pi\omega\nu$ (Sybritos), elsewhere the names $K\alpha\pi\hat{\iota}\omega\nu$ (Lesbos) and $K\eta\pi\hat{\iota}\omega\nu$ (Euboia, LGPN).

Κλήςιππος (T.Flavius, s. Διοτέλης)

Lyttos, 2d c. A.D., honorific inscription.

A.Chaniotis, KretChron 26,1986,82-87 fig.1-2.

Attested in Lappa, Lato, Lyttos (two persons), and in an unknown city (5).

Κνωςίων (?) (Κνωςι-)

Unknown origin (Kato Simi), hellenistic age, graffito on a potsherd.

A.Lembesi, Praktika 1972,202; P.Aupert, BCH 99,1975,687.

Not attested in LGPN, but known in Athens (Pape-Benseler).

A.Lembesi also suggests the reading $Kv\omega c\iota[oc]$ (as an ethnic).

Λαςθένης

Lasthenes 4 in LGPN was a native of Knossos (see App., Si. 6,6,5) and not of Kydonia and is probably the same person as Lasthenes 2 in LGPN, who is not a citizen of Amnisos, but a magistrate of Knossos.

Λυκόνικος (Λυκόνι[κ]ος)

Araden, 2d c. B.C., Delphic list of theorodokoi.

P.Faure, KretChron 21,1969,327s.

Not attested in LGPN and Pape-Benseler. For Crete cf. the names Λύκα, Λύκαινα, Λυκολέων, Λύκος, and Λύκων (LGPN).

Μάγης (s. 'Αςφ[αλ-)

Anopolis, 2d c. B.C., Delphic list of theorodokoi.

P.Faure (and J.Bousquet), KretChron 21,1969,327-329.

No entry in LGPN and Pape-Benseler; in Cyrenaica we have Μάγας and Μάγιος (LGPN).

Μαρίνος (s. Χαρματίων)

Chersonesos, 2d c. A.D., epitaph.

IC I, vii p.44 no.30 (Μαρκιανός); N.Platon, KretChron 8, 1954,515 (Μαρφάκιος); BCH 79,1955,304 (Μαρφάκιος); P.Faure, BCH 89,1965,31 fig.2; id., KretChron 21,1969,325 fig.10 (Μαρῖνος).

Not attested in Crete, but known e.g. in Cyrenaica (LGPN).

Ματάλα (d. 'Ανδροκάδης)

No ethnikon, 3d c. B.C. papyri from Oxyrhynchos.

P.Petrie III 56 b (Ματέλας); BGU VI, 1227 (Μετάλα); Ματάλα proposed by O.Masson, BCH 109,1985,198s.

Not attested in Crete. The port of Gortyn was called Μάταλον or Ματάλα, the name Ματάλη occurs in Thera (Masson o.c. 199).

Ματρόδωρος (s. Νίκελος)

Unknown origin (Kato Simi), hellenistic age, name on tiles (2 cases).

A.Lembesi, Praktika 1973,196.

Attested in Lyttos (1); in Gortyn and Polyrrhenia we have the form Μητρόδωρος (3). The name Ματροδώρα is also once attested in Crete (no ethnic).

Μεγάρη

Aptara, undated, epitaph.

N.Platon, KretChron 12,1958,482; G.Daux, BCH 83,1959,751.

Not attested in Crete; Μεγάρα, is known e.g. in Lesbos (LGPN).

Μενοίτιος (f. 'Ακέςτιμος)

Lyttos, 2d c. A.D., honorific inscription.

G.Rethymiotakis, Λύκτος 1,1985,60ss.

Attested in Kydonia, Polyrrhenia, and in an unknown city (3); cf. Μενοίτας (no ethnic). Νέα (?)

Phaistos, hellenistic age, loomweight.

IC I, xxiii p.278 no.25.

Attested in Gortyn, Lato, and in unknown cities (4). Womens' names often occur on loomweights.¹³

Νεαθνητος (?)

Basiliki Messaras (territory of Gortyn), imperial times, epitaph (now lost).

J.D.S.Pendlebury-M.B.Money Coutts-E.Eccles, BSA 33,1932/33,87.

Not attested in LGPN and Pape-Benseler, possibly missread (Nεάν θ η ϵ ?).

Νεοκύδης Ι (s. Ξένων)

Kydonia, 1st c. B.C., honorific inscription.

J.Tzedakis, Deltion 25 B 2, 1970,471s. (Κύδων); J.-P.Michauld, BCH 97,1973,412 (Κύδων); H. van Effenterre-J.Papaoikonomou-A.-M.Liesenfelt, BCH 107,1983,408 fig.7; SEG XXXIII 735.

Νεοκύδης ΙΙ (f. Cῶςος)

Kydonia, imperial times, dedicatory inscription.

N.Platon, KretChron 12,1958,482.

Already once attested in Kydonia; cf. Νεοκούδης in Keraia (1).

Νικάνδρα

Chersonesos, 1st c. A.D., epitaph.

N.Platon, KretChron 10,1956,419; BCH 81,1957,617 and 619.

Attested in Crete (no ethnic).

Νίκελος (f. Ματρόδωρος)

Unknown origin (Kato Simi), hellenistic age, inscribed tiles (2 cases).

A.Lembesi, Praktika 1973,197.

Not attested in LGPN and Pape-Benseler.

Νικιάδας (Νεικιά[δου], f. Τιμομένης)

Phoinikous, 1st c. B.C./A.D., epitaph.

BCH 80,1956,432 fig.1; P.Faure, KretChron 21,1969,322 no.16 fig.9.

Not attested in Crete, numerous attestations of the form Νικιάδης elsewhere (LGPN).

Ξένων (f. Νεοκύδης)

Kydonia, 1st c. B.C., honorific inscription.

J.Tzedakis, Deltion 25 B 2, 1970,471s.; J.-P.Michauld, BCH 97,1973,412; H. van Effenterre-J.Papaoikonomou-A.-M.Liesenfelt, BCH 107,1983,408 fig.7; SEG XXXIII 735.

Attested in Dreros, Kydonia, Olous, and in an unknown city (4).

'Ολυμπᾶς

Cretan ?, 2nd/3d c. A.D., dipinto on Roman wine-amphoras.

J.W.Hayes, BSA 78,1983,141; SEG XXXIII 734 (at least 3 cases).

Not attested in Crete, where the names Ὀλυμπιάς (Kisamos, Lyttos), Ὀλύμπιος (Lyttos), Ὀλύμπιχος (Chersonesos), and "Ολυμπος (Rhytion) are known. There is one attestation of the name Ὀλυμπᾶς in Cyprus (LGPN).

'Ορφάς Ι (?) ('Ορ[φ]άς, s. 'Ριανός)

Keraia, 2d c. B.C. Delphic list of theorodokoi.

'Ορφάς ΙΙ (?) ('Ορφάς, s. Cταςιμένης)

Kydonia, 2d c. B.C., Delphic list of theorodokoi.

P.Faure (and J.Bousquet), KretChron 21,1969,327 and 329 correct the previous readings 'Ορύας accepted in LGPN (s.v. 'Ορύας 5 and 6). The name is once attested in Delphi (Faure, o.c. 329).

Παιθεμίδας

Cretan ?; 3d c. B.C., hydria from Hadra (Egypt).

B.F.Cook, Inscribed Hadra Vases in the Metropolitan Museum of Art, New York 1966, 26 no.12, pl.iii and xii.

B.F.Cook reads $\pi\alpha\iota/\theta\epsilon/\mu\iota\delta\alpha$. We obviously have to do with the name Παιθεμίδας only known from Crete (4 cases: Gortyn, Rhithymna, and an unknown city).¹⁴

Παιεθενίδας (f. Côcoc)

Aptara, 2d c. B.C., Delphic list of theorodokoi.

P.Faure, KretChron 21,1969,327 and 329 improves the previous reading Παεθενίδας, accepted in LGPN; cf. Παιθεμίδας and Παίστρατος.

Παμφίας ([Π]αμφία)

Unknown origin, hellenistic age, inscribed tile.

A.Lembesi, Praktika 1973,197.

Attested in Arkades (1).

Παρμενίων

Aptara, hellenistic age, epitaph.

N.Platon, KretChron 12,1958,482; G.Daux, BCH 83,1959,751.

Attested in Malla (1).

Πάρμων (?) (Ti.Julius)

Kamilari, imperial times, dedicatory inscription.

N.Platon, KretChron 11,1957,339; M.S.F.Hood, AR 1957,20; G.Daux, BCH 82,1958,794

Not attested in LGPN, but known in Athens (Pape-Benseler); the female name $\Pi\alpha\rho\mu\grave{\omega}$ is attested in Aptara (1). But also the reading $\Pi\alpha\rho\mu\langle\acute{\epsilon}\nu\rangle\omega\nu$ is possible, a name well attested in Crete (5 cases: Knossos, Olous, Polyrrhenia, and an unknown city).

Πέτρος Ι (P[e]tr.)

Cretan?, 6th c. A.D., lead seal.

D.Tsougarakis, BCH 108,1984,732-734 no.4; SEG XXXIV 927.

Πέτρος ΙΙ (h. Ζωή)

Beran Episkopi (byz. Arion or Agrion), 9th c. A.D., dedicatory pillar.

K.D.Kalokyris, Praktika 1959,235; N.Platon, KretChron 13, 1959,379; G.Daux, BCH 84,1960,850.

Attested in Gortyn (1).

Πολύδωρος (s. Τλᾶςις)

Lissos, hellenistic age, decree.

N.Platon, Deltion 16 B, 1960,273.

Not attested in Crete; numerous attestations elsewhere (LGPN).

Πρίκτος (= Φρίξος)

Axos, late 7th c. B.C., mitra.

The editors of LGPN accept the reading "Οπρικοος τόνδε ἦλε (s.v. "Οπριξος), thus recognizing here an otherwise not known name. Since the name Φρίξος is already known in Cretan Eltynia, we rather have to read ὁ Πρίκοος τόνδε ἦλε; see P.Faure, KretChron 21,1969,318 no.6. The mitra was not found in Arkades (LGPN), but in Axos. 15

Πυρίας (Πυρί[α], s. Οθένιος)

Keraia, late hellenistic age, epitaph.

P.Faure, BCH 86,1962,52 fig.14 (ΠΥΡΡΑC); id., KretChron 21,1969,322 no.15 fig.8; SEG XXIII 577.

The form Πυρρία*c* is attested in Kantanos (2); a name Πυρία (fem. nom. or masc. gen. ?) is known in Aptara (LGPN).

'Ροῦφος ('Ρο[ῦφος], s. 'Αρτεμίδωρος)

Lyttos, 2d/3d c. A.D., epitaph.

A.Lembesi, Deltion 32 B2, 1977, 316 pl.189 b; SEG XXXIV 921.

Attested in Lebena and Lyttos (6).

On the text of the inscription see under Artemidoros.

Cηρίων (s. Δέξιος)

Elyros, hellenistic age, decree.

N.Platon, KretChron 13,1959,377; G.Daux, BCH 84,1960,852.

Not attested in LGPN and Pape-Benseler; cf. Θηρίων in Eretria (LGPN).¹⁶

Cθένιος (s. Εὐκλῆς)

Keraia, no date, epitaph.

P.Faure, KretChron 21,1969,323 no.17c.

The inscription had been seen by villagers of Meskla and is now lost.

Attested in Keraia (1).

*Cωcικλ*η̂*c*

Kastri Keratokambou, no date, pithos lid.

N.Platon, Praktika 1960,293.

Attested in Arkades, Kydonia, Lyttos, and in an unklnown city (6).

Cῶςις (f. Θεύκριτος)

Aptara, 1st s. B.C., epitaph.

N.Platon, KretChron 12,1958,469; G.Daux, BCH 83,1959,749.

N.Platon read Θεύκριτος .ώςιος. The name is obviously Cῶςις, attested in Axos and Hierapytna (2).

Cω**c**ίτιμο**c**

Lissos, hellenistic, dedicatory inscription.

N.Platon, KretChron 13,1959,377; G.Daux, BCH 84,1960,852.

Not attested in Crete, but known e.g. in Rhodos (LGPN). For Crete cf. the name Cώτιμοc (4 cases).

Cῶcoc (s. Νεοκύδης)

Kydonia, imperial times, dedicatory inscription.

N.Platon, KretChron 12,1958,482; G.Daux, BCH 83,1959,749.

One of the most common Cretan names, attested among other places in Aptara, Eleutherna, Elyros, Hierapytna, Kantanos, Keraia, Kydonia (twice), Lappa, Lissos, Lyttos, Phalasarna, Polyrrhenia, Syia, and Tarrha (57).

Τιλώ (?)

Phaistos, imperial times, loomweight.

IC I, xxiii p.278 no.28.

On the weight F.Halbherr had read $TI\Delta\Omega C$ and M.Guarducci tentatively thought of a form, derived from the latin nomen gentile Tidius. The name $T\upsilon\delta\epsilon\dot{\upsilon}c$ is attested in Chios and Lesbos, the name $T\dot{\upsilon}\delta\eta c$ in Cyrenaica (LGPN). But it is also possible, that F.Halbherr missread an inscription $TI\Lambda\Omega C$; the name $T\dot{\iota}\lambda\omega\nu$ is known in Arkades, and loomweights very often bear female names in genitiv (see note 13).

Τιμόδαμος

Chersonesos, 1st c. A.D., epitaph.

N.Platon, KretChron 10,1956,419; BCH 81,1957,617 and 619.

Not attested in Crete, but well known elsewhere (LGPN).

Τιμόες (d. Δεξικλης)

Aptara, no date, epitaph.

N.Platon, KretChron 12,1958,482; G.Daux, BCH 83,1959,751.

Not attested in LGPN and Pape-Benseler. For Crete cf. for instance Τιμώ and Τιμωνίς.

Τιμόλας (?)

Eastern Crete, undated, loomweight.

C.Davaras, 'Αρχαιολογική Έφημερίς, 1980,39 no.50.

C.Davaras reads $T \mu o [\lambda---]/A \Delta P C Y$ ---. The name Timolas is attested in Lato (1), but the fem. $T \mu o \lambda \alpha$ is also possible, since female names usually occur on loomweights (s. note 13).

Τιμομένης (Τημομένης, s. Νικιάδας)

Phoinikous, 1st c. B.C./A.D., epitaph.

BCH 80,1956,432 fig.1; P.Faure, KretChron 21,1969,322 no.16 fig.9.

Atttested in Polyrrhenia and Tarrha (6).

Τλᾶσισ (f. Πολύδωρος)

Lissos, hellenistic age, decree.

N.Platon, Deltion 16 B, 1960,273.

Not attested in Crete; The name Τλῆcιc is known in Delos (LGPN); cf. Τλάcων in Cyrene, Τληcιάδηc in Paros, Τληcίβιοc in Euboia, Τληcίδαμοc in Ios, Τληcιμένηc in Delos, and Τλήcωμιc in Crete (LGPN).

Τύχα

Aptara, no date, epitaph.

N.Platon, KretChron 12,1958,483; G.Daux, BCH 83,1959,752.

Not attested in Crete in this form; one attestation in Mytilene (LGPN).

For Crete cf. the names Τύχη (Inatos), Τύχαινα (Olous), and Τυχώι (Chersonesos and Apollonia).

Τυχώ

Apollonia/Panormos (Agia Pelagia), 5th c. B.C., graffito on an Attic cup.

S.Alexiou, Deltion 29 B 3, 1973/74,900.

Attested in Chersonesos (1).

Ύπάτιος (?)

Syia, 6th c. A.D., monogram on an altar.

A.K.Orlandos, KretChron 7,1953,358.

Not attested in LGPN,. several examples in Pape-Benseler.

Ύπεργένης (s. Εὐρυμήδης)¹⁷

Diatonion, 2d c. B.C., epitaph in Ptolemais.

Y.Landau, BASO 224,1976,39-40; SEG XXVI 1679.

Attested in Knossos (1).

Χαρίδαμος (s. "Αρχων)

Lappa 2d c. B.C., Delphic list of theorodokoi.

P.Faure, KretChron 21,1969,328s. (correction of the previous reading Ἐχαρίδας).

Attested in Hierapytna and Itanos (2).
