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THE PROPER NAME Πακιᾶς / Πάκιος

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In SB VI 9181,9 = P.Cairo Isid. 29,9 the proper name Πακιᾶς can be found.¹ In SB I 5124,215 there is a question of Παστύένης Πακία and in F. Preisigke, NB 258 we find the proper name Πακίας listed.² We are, however, dealing with the short genitive Πακιᾶ (cf. ZPE 64, 1986, 119f.) of the same proper name Πακιᾶς.³

In the papyrological onomastica only one example of the proper name Πάκιος is listed (P.Oxy. VII 1048,2).⁴ The name occurs in the genitive (Πακίου) in the Oxyrhynchos text. Theoretically Πακίου could as well be the genitive of the proper name Πακίας.⁵ However, since the proper names Πάκις and Πάκκιος⁶ are more than once attested, it is reasonable to postulate, besides the male proper name Πακιᾶς the proper name Πάκιος (and not Πακίας).⁷
