## List of Names from Coptos

UC 35038 11.6 cm x 10.1 cm Coptos

This ostracon list of names from Coptos formerly in the collection of Sir Henry Wellcome<sup>1</sup>, the manufacturing chemist, in the Wellcome Institute of the History of Medicine is now housed in the Petrie Museum in the Department of Egyptology in University College London.<sup>2</sup> The text is written on the convex surface of a pink ceramic water jar which is ribbed on the concave side. There is no pitch on the inner surface. The scribe wrote in carbon ink in a firm, upright, slightly cursive script of the second century A.D. which is largely bilinear using a nib 1 mm wide. Rho, iota and psi protrude below the line; the left limb of kappa rises above it.

The Latin names Lucius (3, 4), Lollius (5), and Sulla (7) suggest that their owners may have been Roman auxiliary soldiers or their children. The Ala Vocontiorum was stationed in the area of Coptos from A.D. 113<sup>3</sup> to 165<sup>4</sup>, and is found at Palmyra in A.D. 183<sup>5</sup>, being replaced at Coptos by the Ala Herculiana by A.D. 1856, which itself was previously stationed at Palmyra in A.D. 167.7 But soldiers of other units pass through Coptos to the forts in the desert to the east.


