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## P.LOND. III 1274C: SALE OF A CALF

A brown papyrus which preserves the right and upper part of a document. The right hand edge is slightly broken. The back is blank. The measurements of the fragment are 6 x 9.6 cm. The writing is along the fibres. The text is described as a fragment of the first-second centuries A.D. It is a sale of calf in the form of an ὁμολογία (ll. 1-3 date; ll. 3-5 place of the concluded document; ll. 5-9 the parties of the agreement; ll. 9-14 the terms of the sale). The seller is Patermouthis and the buyer is Stotoetis. The price is lost. The sale took place in Polydeukeia, a village of the Arsinoite nome. This is the only example so far where this village is connected with sale of cattle; see A. Jördens, Sozialstrukturen im Arbeitstierhandel des kaiserzeitlichen Ägypten, Tyche 10 (1995), pp. 79-81. At the end there is an appendix in which references to prices of calves in the papyri are listed; cf. P.Cair.Cent. 62, p. 353; H.-J. Year [...] of the Emperor [Caesar] Domitianus Augustus Germanicus, Choiach [...], in Polydeukeia of the division of Themistos of the Arsinoite nome. Patermouthis [son of NN] aged about 4[0 with a scar on ...] on the left side agrees that he has sold to Stotoetis [son of NN] aged about 5[0 with a scar on the] right [...], from his own cattle a calf [...] just as it is, not liable to be rejected, and that I, the acknowledging party Patermouthis, receive the price in full ...

1-3 The document is to be dated in the month Choiach (27/28 November to 26/27 December) in a year of the reign of Domitian between A.D. 81 (first year) and A.D. 95 (15th year; in November/December 96 Domitian was already dead). As there is space for only one digit after the month name, the most probable date is 27/28 November (Choiach 1) to 6/7 December (Choiach 10).

6-14 In the lost part of the papyrus we suggest the following supplements at the beginning of each line:

- 6 The name of Patermouthis' father.  
 7 A number following τεσσαράκοντα of the preceding line, and then a phrase such as οὐλὴ μετώπῳ] ἐξ ὀρι(στε-  
 ρῶν).  
 8 The name of Stotoetis' father.  
 9 A number following πεντήκοντα of the preceding line, and then a phrase such as οὐλὴ ἀντικνημίῳ δε]ξιῶτι.  
 10 The dative of the buyer's name or the pronoun αὐτῷ, and then probably a reference to the market-place, ἐν ἀγορᾷ.  
 11 A phrase like ὑπαρχόντι[των αὐτῷ βοϊκ]ῶν κτηνῶν or ὑπαρχόντι[των αὐτῷ ταυρικ]ῶν κτηνῶν. This phrase is quite  
 similar to P.Lond. II 282, 11-13 (A.D. 69) ἀπὸ τῶν ὑπαρχόντων [αὐτῷ] ὄνται ὄνται κτηνῶν ὅνον.  
 12 The gender, the age, the colour or other special feature of the animal; cf. P.Mich. IX 523, 13 (Karanis; A.D. 66) μόσχον  
 τέλειον πυρρόχ(ρουν).
