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SIMONIDES. PMG 541

A re-examination of the papyrus (P. Oxy. 2432) in the Ashmolean Library has made possible a number of improvements to Lobel's readings: these are set out below, together with some new supplements. For a bibliography, see D. E. Gerber, *Lustrum* 36 (1994), 138f. I am grateful to Dr M. L. West for his comments.

- 20. [, a trace of an upright at mid-letter level above 'the bottom left-hand arc of a circle' reported by Lobel, which will represent its decorated foot.
